

Cleveland Clinic and ITM Collaborate On the Global Critical Care Transport Project

The Worlds First Advanced Practice – Global Critical Care Transport Flight Nurse Program:

Christopher Manacci, MSN, ACNP, is the Architect and Managing nurse practitioner of critical care transport for the Cleveland Clinic (<http://my.clevelandclinic.org>), where he is responsible for operational and clinical practice oversight. He is also the architect and founding director of the Flight Nursing Program at the Frances Payne Bolton School of Nursing at Case Western Reserve University (<http://fpb.case.edu/>), and is recognized as the international expert in commercial critical care transport venues.

Mr. Manacci developed the world's first university based graduate level educational program for air medical service. And he developed and put into practice the first critical care air rescue and evacuation service, utilizing acute care nurse practitioners as the central clinician of a dynamic team for all critical care disease demographics.

Currently, he is the director of the world renowned Flight Nurse Program he created at Case Western Reserve University (<http://www.case.edu>), and implemented for the Cleveland Clinic -- education and research top his agenda. Among the many Continuing Medical Educations and Training Programs in 2002, he established the first **International Flight Nursing Academy Summer Camp**(<http://flightnurse.case.edu/summercamp.shtm>).
